5. The hospital also does kidney transplants.

Phone Investigation Recording

Investigator: Hello, hello, is that the liver transplant department on the 8th floor of the First Hospital of Kunming?

Nurse: Yes, this is.

Investigator: Ah, I have a question. A friend of mine wants to do liver transplant here, are you still doing it?

Nurse: Yes. Just come to our hospital and talk to our doctors.

Investigator: Aren’t you a doctor?

Nurse: I am not.

Investigator: Do you work here then?

Nurse: I am a nurse. If you would like to ask about this kind of things, you can only come here to ask the doctors for details.

Investigator: Oh. I am calling from a remote place, a place very far away. I just want to ask if your hospital do (organ transplantation) here. One for...

Nurse: Yes. We do. We do it.

Investigator: A lot?

Nurse: A lot.

Investigator: A lot? (Nurse: Right.) Take liver transplants for example, how many do you do in a year?

Nurse: Several hundred cases a year. For this year, only half a year has passed by now.

Investigator: A few hundreds in half a year?

Nurse: Anyway, we did over 300 cases last year.

Investigator: Oh. Over 300 cases last year?

Nurse: Right.

Investigator: Then at least you have done 100 or 200 cases by now this year? As half a year has passed.

Nurse: For sure. There must be no less than 100 cases.

Investigator: No less than 100 cases. That is, you have done quite a lot. Can you tell me which director usually does the transplant surgeries?

Nurse: Director Zhang and our hospital's president usually do them.

Investigator: Oh, the president. What is his last name? Is it his last name Jiang? Ran? Ran Jianghua? Is it him?

Nurse: Ran Jianghua is the dean of our department. There is a president for the hospital.

Investigator: You also have President Zhao? Do they all do transplants?

Nurse: They both do.

Investigator: OK. Then I would like to ask about the liver sources. Where can I go to wait for them? I mean where the liver sources are from, the liver sources?

Nurse: You first need to apply for them. After your application, we will assign the liver to you, if we receive liver sources.

Investigator: Are they sourced locally or from other places?

Nurse: As long as you apply for them, no matter where they are, the livers would be delivered here.

Investigator: Oh. If I apply, can you tell me where I should go to apply?

Nurse: Well, I have told you, regarding this type of questions, during the daytime tomorrow, many doctors will be here, including our director. You can call this number tomorrow to ask.

Investigator: So in this hospital, in addition to liver transplants, do you also do kidney transplants?

Nurse: As for kidney transplants, it's not our department. It is the Urological Surgery Department. They do kidney transplants.

Investigator: Do you do a lot of kidney transplants? Kidney transplants?

Nurse: Well, I do not know much about kidney transplants, because my department does liver transplants. You need to ask the Urological Surgery Department about kidney transplants.

Investigator: OK. That's good. Thank you. I will call tomorrow, if I get a chance.

Nurse: OK.
