Phone Investigation Recording

Investigator: I would like to ask you that I have a patient, who wants to do kidney transplantation, so do you do it right now? Do you do a relatively large number of cases? Are there lots of patients waiting in line?

Doctor: There are less people waiting than in Wu Han.

Investigator: That is great!

Doctor: Before the registration to line up, the patients need to do some preoperative examinations and tissue typing. You have to wait for half year to one year here for the kidney transplantation.

Investigator: Can the surgery time be scheduled earlier?

Doctor: What?

Investigator: Can the wait time be shorter?

Doctor: I am not sure. In some people’s cases, it would be very fast; in some other cases...since nowadays the kidney sources all come from the central government’s donations, the blood types are uncertain, and tissue typing is also required. So I am not sure of the wait times.

Investigator: Oh. So you mean that your hospital’s performance regarding this type of surgeries is quite good? Do you do a lot in your hospital?

Doctor: Right, right.

Investigator: I hope you understand my feelings. On one hand, I hope that we can do the surgery, and on the other hand, I hope that the wait time can be short. So I think if

you do a lot, a short wait time is possible. So there's hope. Do you do a lot? And how many organ transplants did you do this year? Like this type of surgeries?

Doctor: We did roughly more than a dozen (cases).

Investigator: More than a dozen? Do you do them every month? (Doctor: Yes.) So it means that you do them every month.

Doctor: Not exactly. Sometimes we would do a lot in a month, and sometimes we don't do even one case for several months.

Investigator: Oh.

Doctor: We did several dozens of kidney transplants every year in the previous several years. We did less this year. We did 40 or 50 kidney transplants per year last year and the year before last year.

Investigator: You mean you can perform 40 or 50 kidney transplants in a year.

Doctor: Yes. We do far less than Tongji Hospital.

Investigator: Tongji Hospital does a lot (of cases).

Doctor: I estimate that they perform more than 300 cases!

Investigator: Ok. Isn't there a national website, which is charge of the unified allocation of organs?

Doctor: Yes. This type of allocation is preferable to the hospital, which procures the organs. If they can't use them, then they allot it out.

Investigator: So Tongji Hospital is in this situation.

Doctor: They give priority to the patients, who are waiting in line there.

Investigator: And would the entire country supply them with the donors?

Doctor: I don't know. We are not clear about this.

Investigator: Are all of your donors sourced locally?

Doctor: Yes. They're all from Shi Yan locally, from five counties and one city.

Investigator: Are the donors healthy? In general, they have no illness, right?

Doctor: They've all been evaluated.

Investigator: Ok. Thank you.

Doctor: Ok, no problem.

Investigator: Which director is more skillful?

Doctor: The surgeries are all operated by our Director Guo, (Investigator: Director Guo) the director of our department.

Investigator: Ok. He's surnamed Guo. Director Guo.

Doctor: Right.

Investigator: Thank you. Goodbye.
