Mr. Jing, the body donation station of Capital Medical University (Jing Peng)

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Summary

1. (In our hospital) body donations are dozens a year, four or fifty this year.
2. Beijing, one year, at the most, one hundred or two.
3. Organ donation (in Beijing) is not carried out.
4. Many hospitals have organ donation, the Red Cross will not be specifically responsible for this matter.
5. Many of them have not passed the Red Cross now!
6. Its destination is for teaching and research. There is no other use. It will not be donated to hospitals. There is no such thing, no such situation.
7. No payment. Totally no payment. Oh yes, you have to make this clear to him. After the body is used, it is also cremated, cremated, but they cannot return the ashes to the family, because this is collective cremation, it is a batch, you cannot tell who is who, so the ashes cannot be returned to the family.

Telephone Investigation Recording

Dr. Jing: Hello, greetings!

Investigator: Hello, are you the body donation station of the Affiliated Hospital of Capital Medical University?

Dr. Jing: This is the donation office of the Capital Medical University.

It's not affiliated hospital, this is itself the Capital Medical University.

Investigator: Oh. Because I just called Doctor Zhi who called You'an Hospital, Doctor Zhi. I have a friend~

Dr. Jing: Hmm

Investigator: Dr. Zhi, she is Specialist Zhi, Specialist Zhi.

Dr. Jing: Oh.

Investigator: Because I have a friend, he has a family member who is seriously ill and wants to donate the body. I told him this. He said what disease. I said it is cancer. He said that cancer cannot do organ donation, can only do body donation, he said that I will give you a phone number (Jing Jing: right). So he gave me your number. Well, I want to get some information. How does body donation work? What is going on? How does it work?

Dr. Jing: Is that so. Is he in Beijing?

Investigator: Yes, in Yanqing. He lives in Yanqing.

Dr. Jing: Oh. If that is the case, if he, or his family can come to us to pick up forms, or if they cannot do it, isn't that quite far? If they cannot pick the forms, then they can download the forms from the Beijing Red Cross Society's website. There is a registration form. Fill the registration form, have him sign it, his family sign it, it will work.

Investigator: Oh, you don't need to go and check?

Dr. Jing: No way to go there. No way. Because there are no dedicated people to do that, secondly, different places in Beijing are too far. They are from all districts or counties. First we do not know the way, secondly we cannot return within a day.

Investigator: Oh. Then I want to ask you, say body donation like in his case, you just said a form needs to be filled. This is very important. Then where does his body go after donation?

Dr. Jing: Its destination is for teaching and research. There is no other use. It will not be donated to hospitals. There is no such thing, no such situation.

Investigator: Oh. Can't you harvest the organs and let the hospitals to do transplantation?

Dr. Jing: That cannot be done. In his situation it cannot be done. Because when it is a dead body, the organs are useless.

Investigator: Oh, so, Doctor, I want to ask you. In his case, will he be paid? Will there be some payment?

Dr. Jing: No payment. Totally no payment. Oh yes, you have to make this clear to him. After the body is used, it is also cremated, cremated, but they cannot return the ashes to the family, because this is collective cremation, it is a batch, you cannot tell who is who, so the ashes cannot be returned to the family.

Investigator: Oh, oh, oh.

Dr. Jing: This has to be made clear to him. So I will recommend that he do not come here to pick up the forms. So on the website of Beijing Red Cross Society, there is an application for body donation.

Investigator: Oh, oh. So in a hospital such as yours, are there many body donations? Many people donate? How many in a year?

Dr. Jing: Dozens a year.

Investigator: Not even a hundred?

Dr. Jing: Not many, not a hundred. Because in Beijing totally there can be more than a hundred. Just one hospital, such as ours, there cannot be a hundred.

Investigator: Oh, so the whole Beijing is more than a hundred. As large as Beijing, there are only more than a hundred bodies?

Dr. Jing: Yes, Beijing can be this many, about a hundred to two hundred, at most.

Investigator: Oh, so each year there are so many. Oh, that is not too many. It means people's attitude is not quite, toward the donation, is still quite conservative, is that so?

Dr. Jing: Yes yes yes. You are right. It's not conservative. It's a wrong attitude. We don't say conservative or not, just his attitude is not right. Some people just say, after I donate, what do I get? Is that so? There is a problem like that.

Investigator: The family asked me to ask about payment. You just said no payment. Dr. Jing: Correct. That is the case. Another issue is, what you mentioned the issue of payment. Medical treatment expenses, the family is still responsible for them. Including after death the storage in the mortuary of the hospital, the family has to take care of. Only the final transportation of the body we will take care of.

Investigator: Oh, oh, OK.

Dr. Jing: Hmm, you can tell all these to the family, and then be clear about it. Then please discuss with the family. If they agree, then we can discuss further.

Investigator: Then we will call you again? What is your name? I will ask him to contact you?

Dr. Jing: My name is Jing, Jing as in Feng Jing.

Investigator: Additionally, I also want to ask, are you related to the Red Cross Society? Any connection? The Red Cross Society can go there and inspect.

Dr. Jing: Red Cross Society, we are managed by it.

Investigator: Are you under the Red Cross Society of Beijing or the Country?

Dr. Jing: Beijing. The national level one manages that of Beijing, and the Beijing one manages us.

Investigator: Oh, so in the beginning, I called the Red Cross Society of Beijing. There is a, with last name Wang, not sure about the name, last name is Wang. I asked him about organ donation. He said they had never done organ donation. He said they had established the office for six years, and never did that. I said how come your Red Cross Society does not do it? He said we just did not start it, still in the stage of preparation. Is that so?

Dr. Jing: Red Cross Society usually is not responsible for that. The detailed situation is like that, as far as I know, many hospitals have organ donations, but the Red Cross Society is not responsible for that specifically.

Investigator: So he said he never did that, never did organ donations, as for body donations.

Dr. Jing: It never did that itself. The Red Cross Society is not a hospital. Why does it do that? It has no use.

Investigator: No, just they did not do that. He said they have not started this work.

Dr. Jing: Correct. You are talking about organ donations? Or body donations? If organ donations, then they did not do it.

Investigator: They did not do it. But why? Each province is doing that. Why don't they do it?

Dr. Jing: No, the hospitals have it. So why do they do it again?

Investigator: So the Red Cross Society...

Dr. Jing: Every hospital, many hospitals have it. Many hospitals have it, so they don't need to.

Investigator: So the organs are done by the hospitals.

Dr. Jing: It's actually like this. They don't do it, that is only a formality. In reality, say, in reality, its individual hospitals that carry it out. If it's organ donation, then it's at individual hospitals. If it's body donations, then it's at the individual universities.

Investigator: Hehe, then I am surprised. I said isn't the Red Cross Society responsible for the organs? How come you don't do it? Dr. Jing: Hmm, they do not specialize in organs. It's not their specialty. Even if they do, they will not be directly responsible for doing it. If they are all donated to them, it cannot be. They will ask you to contact individual hospitals. As for donation...

Investigator: He said, we never did organ donations, never, there is no such business.

Dr. Jing: That is possible, possible.

Investigator: Possible?

Dr. Jing: It is possible.

Dr. Jing: Yes, many hospitals have the organs, such as the Union Medical College, Tongren Hospital, and Youan Hospital, they all have organ donations. They have different target, and different emphasis.

Investigator: So if the Red Cross Society does not do it, aren't the organ donations certified and signed by the Red Cross Society? If the hospitals do it themselves, then they do not go through the Red Cross Society for verification and certification?

Dr. Jing: Right now, many did not go through the Red Cross Society.

Investigator: Ah, did not?

Dr. Jing: Right now many did not go through the Red Cross Society. Correct.

Investigator: Including the body donation, they don't need to certify and verify?

Dr. Jing: Hmm, generally speaking, it is their jurisdiction. But as far as specific execution, specific execution, it is up to individual unit. It is not executed by them, so it does not quite care about the issue of execution.

Investigator: So each hospital is responsible for itself. The Armed Police does a lot, don't they? Usually they do a lot of organ transplantations. So they do not go through the Red Cross Society?

Dr. Jing: I do not know. Should not, should not be through them. I don't know if they go through them. Should not. They don't do it. They don't manage it directly, so should not be through them.

Investigator: Oh, so each hospital does its own business, and take care of donor organs by themselves. So they have nothing to do with the Beijing Red Cross Society?

Dr. Jing: As long as it is legal, as long as it is legal.

Investigator: Is that so. So it does not matter if they go through certification by the Red Cross Society. Verification is not important?

Dr. Jing: There is no such thing as verification or not, as long as it is legal, it will do.

Investigator: Oh, is that so. Then that is it. Now I know. I will go back and tell him, tell him the situation that you talked about. Or visit the website to download a form.

Dr. Jing: You can tell him the details, yes tell him the details.

Investigator: So as far as this year, in the university, how many bodies were donated?

Dr. Jing: Forty to fifty.

Investigator: That is OK. That is not bad.

Dr. Jing: OK, OK, so I am very obliged.

Investigator: OK, goodbye.

Dr. Jing: OK. No problem.

Investigator: Thank you.

Dr. Jing: No problem, no problem. Goodbye.
