Phone Investigation Recording

Investigator: Oh, you're driving. Sorry. Here is my question. We have been doing very poorly with organ donations here, I mean very few organ donations for transplants. In Yantai, hospitals do a lot of organ transplants. I want to ask you: are there a lot of donors (in Yantai) now? Can you provide us with some support (to get organs)?

Red Cross: We are not in charge of this. We only take care of the (donation) registration. As to the specific donation process, it is the responsibility of the system.

Investigator: Our quantity of organ transplants is too small. You know, there are too few donors, therefore, we want to ask for help. You know, the quantity of organ transplants in Shandong is huge! Especially in the Yantai area, like Yuhuangding (Hospital), they have done a lot. So I thought, you probably have a lot of donors.

Red Cross: There are not many organ donors anywhere! Ha, not many anywhere! Yeah, ah, and the Red Cross is not in charge of this distribution of organs, it also ~

Red Cross: We only do registration. Regarding how to use the organs, how to get them and how to distribute them, it doesn't matter to us. We can't control any of these! Investigator: Yuhuangding (Hospital) has so many organs, and as they have done so many transplants, aren't those organs provided by the Red Cross?

Red Cross: Ah, they (Yuhuangding Hospital) have their own channels to procure organs. That is possibly the case. Not all their organs are donated, and donations are very few. We have only a few dozens of donors, but they have done hundreds, even thousands of (organ transplant) cases! It's not that we have a lot of donors; it's that they have a lot of ways to get organs! Ha, it has nothing to do with our Red Cross.

Investigator: Oh, I thought you provided (those organs), so I called you.

Red Cross: Um, we Red Cross only (takes care of organ) donation. As to where other organs come from, we do not investigate. We are not the public security, nor any of that kind. We do not know!
