### World Organization to Investigate the Persecution of Falun Gong (WOIPFG)

#### Summary

1. Wang has no problem supplying 10 to 20 livers and 40 to 50 kidneys to a hospital every month.

When confirming the donor quantity,

Investigator: It should be no problem for us to conduct 10 to 20 liver [transplants] and 40 to 50 kidney [transplants] per month. You can guarantee [the organ supplies], right?

Mr. Wang: Guaranteed, 100% guaranteed. Rest assured about this.

2. Operating procedure:

The investigator and Mr. Wang confirmed the procedure: the hospital will, upon confirming that there's a patient waiting for an organ transplant, send the patient's medical records and test results to Mr. Wang, and provide the patient with Wang's phone number. When the patient connects with Wang, then Wang would have established a formal connection with the hospital.

Wang confirmed his guaranteed donor supply and urged the hospital (i.e. the investigator) to contact the patient and to tell the patient to directly contact Wang, then he will bring the patient to the hospital, together with the donor. Wang asks for the referral of patients in good conditions, physically and financially, for smooth handling and a high success rate.

3. Mr. Wang: When (surgeries) are performed in other hospitals, we can add a little bit of profit for you (in our pricing), more or less, do you know? We add a little bit of profit for the doctor, who's mainly in charge of this or the director. It's roughly, basically around 50,000 yuan...I will add another 50,000 yuan for you, and then you allocate the money among yourselves, okay?

Investigator: Oh, ah, Chao-Yang and the First Central Hospital, Tianjin First Central Hospital also work like this?

Mr. Wang: Yes, yes.

4. Physical examinations are done at the Beijing Armed Forces General Hospital, Operations are done at Chao-Yang Hospital. The two procedures appear to be separately carried out this way.

5. Mr. Wang: This is very crucial. Their procedure is that every year, Chao-Yang would have a quota, do you know?... Within the spot in the quota, when he performs a surgery for one patient, for instance, Wang So-and-so, he would do it according to the normal procedures. That is, brain death, or (organ)

donations of this kind. After performing a surgery for this patient, he does it again.... when we do it again, it would be imposture. Using Wang So-and-so's spot within the quota to perform surgeries for other people.

6.The real name of one single person can be used to perform surgeries for more than a dozen individuals.

7.The director at Chao-Yang Hospital prepares stamps and performs the forgery in paperwork. Wang reminds the doctors that their hospitals cannot report the actual large number of operations to the Ministry of Health.

8.In Chao-Yang Hospital, Zhang Xiaodong and another director are performing the operation.

9.There are at least four people like Wang providing organs to Chao-Yang Hospital. And each month each of them can do more than 20 organ transplants outside the hospital.

10.Mr. Wang: They didn't report, didn't report that many cases to the higher authorities, you know? You know, there are many, according to me, which are not reported at all, you know. There are way too many people! It's a little, a little, a little bit against common sense, you know.

11.Mr. Wang: We have (organ sources) all over the country, do you know? We have them everywhere. Whenever you need one, one will arrive, oh.... Beijing and Zhengzhou are the two main places. There are also from Guangdong, Guangxi.

12.It takes one week to perform a surgery, including travel time, and it's the same for kidney and liver transplants.

13.Mr. Wang admits there are indeed Falun Gong practitioners' organs being used.

Mr. Wang: Hum, now the current situation is: you should use those from the society as well. Do you understand? We're just doing it under this banner.

Investigator: Well, well, so, don't you understand? The donor, no matter who you say he/she is, once we start the organ excision, we'll learn the real situation. It doesn't matter, he/she is a Falun Gong practitioner. Frankly, that's it. But you dare not yet directly say that all of them are Falun Gong practitioners, ah, (Mr. Wang: Okay.) a small portion, you say. We do not care whether you say it this way or not, but let's have an understanding between us, eh, (Mr. Wang: Okay.) listen, so we say the organs are all from Falun Gong practitioners. (Mr. Wang: Okay.) But you deliberately say that you get them from the society, well, that's also fine. (Regarding the organ source,) we would say that... That will be it.

Mr. Wang: Okay.

14.Investigator: As for the nature of these people, we have just agreed. Hey, what did you say, let's say, let's say, but at least basically, we know that they are (the organs) of Falun Gong practitioners. Ah, that will be fine.

Mr. Wang: Okay, okay, hmmm.

15. Wang said that before a transplant was done, the investigator couldn't come to meet people from his hospital... "After finishing one operation, then we become a family."

16. Wang says that Zheng Shusen did a lot of operations in the early years. He did a lot of liver transplants.

#### Phone Investigation Recording

Investigator: Hey, Mr. Wang, hello.

Mr. Wang: Hey, hello, hello.

Investigator: Hey, yeah, this is the situation. I went back to discuss this with the main executives and department heads in charge of this area in both of our hospitals. They are very interested, and they are quite willing to do this. So today we'll talk about some more substantive things. That is, they posed...there are several questions. The first is that for the first batch, they still want to do one liver (transplant) and two kidney (transplants). This is because if you do kidney (transplants) alone, our No. 2 hospital will do it, but our No. 1 hospital will have nothing to do.

Mr. Wang: Hmm, hmm, hmm, hmm.

Investigator: What do you think?

Mr. Wang: Okay, okay.

Investigator: Good, okay, at the beginning, we'll do a little bit. And then, judging from our current technologies and our strength, it should be no problem for us to conduct 10 to 20 liver (transplants) and 40 to 50 kidney (transplants) per month. This will work, right?

Mr. Wang: This, well, this works.

Investigator: Good, you can guarantee (the organ supplies), right?

Mr. Wang: Guaranteed, 100% guaranteed. Rest assured about this.

Investigator: Hmm, there's more. That is, the second question is that we now reach agreement through discussion, and after the patient confirms, we'll give you his medical history and send you his physical examination results. At the same time, we'll tell the patient to follow your method, that is, we'll give your phone number to the patient and ask him to contact you.

Mr. Wang: Yes.

Investigator: Right? But the information goes through us. We also give the patient some information, and the patient can also give you (his information), but it won't be detailed. Because the patient cannot be given too much of this information. But after the patient contacts you, you will formally contact us, right?

Mr. Wang: Hmm, hmm, right.

Investigator: This is the procedure, right?

Mr. Wang: Right, right, right. But what will you tell the patient? You will tell him That I have this thing here, right?

Investigator: We will say that, as far as we know, there is hope to connect such a channel. "You can go to give it a try."

Mr. Wang: Hmm, hmm, then here is a problem. That is, regarding the money, shall we directly quote him our profit? Or shall we add it up with your profit, too?

Investigator: Ah, then let's do it this way. Let's keep them separate. You deal with him only about the organ, and we will provide him with the treatment. We can do a surgery for him, but we cannot do that without an organ. After he contacts you and obtains the organ, we'll perform the surgery for him. As for how much the organ costs, he will find it on his own. We will talk about free voluntary organ donations, donations by citizens. This would be free, and the organ wouldn't cost money.

Mr. Wang: Hmm, hmm, hmm.

Investigator: Is this okay?

Mr. Wang: That is, that is to say, your hospital is only responsible for the surgery, which will be carried out normally. And then how much money he will spend in the hospital, how much money...for our part, we just handle the things between us and him. That is, we won't include your profit (when we charge him), right?

Investigator: Right, not included. We will directly deal with him. You will directly deal with him. Regarding the financial aspect, you just directly tell him how much he's supposed to pay, then it is over.

Mr. Wang: Hmm.

Investigator: How much he should pay you; you just ask him for it. He does not need to tell us, right?

Mr. Wang: Sure. Yes, yes. In this way, since we... I contact with you... Normally, when (surgeries) are performed in other hospitals, we can add a little bit of profit for you (in our pricing), more or less, do you know? We add a little bit of profit for the doctor, who's mainly in charge of this or the director. It's roughly, basically around 50,000 yuan. This is up to you yourselves to decide. If you accept it, then we will add this (into the pricing) for you. If you don't accept it, then forget it. It's up to you yourselves.

Investigator: Oh, ah, Chao-Yang and the First Central Hospital, Tianjin First Central Hospital also work like this?

Mr. Wang: Yes, yes.

Investigators: Including the Armed Police General Hospital, they are all like this, too, right?

Mr. Wang: Yes, yes, yes.

Investigator: Then let's do this, same as others in the profession. They add in the profit, then we also add in the profit. What you said also makes sense. Others don't need it. What's important are the ones who take the donors (organs) in the operating room, those several doctors and nurses who are in the operating room. These several people need it; the others don't. As for the others, we and the hospital share the profit normally.

Mr. Wang: Then I will give you...I will add another 50,000 yuan for you, and then you allocate the money among yourselves, okay?

Investigator: 50,000, ha-ha, okay. Let's take 50,000 first to see how it goes. Because

there're some...

Mr. Wang: Yes, yes, right. Let's do it first. In fact, now is the early stage, which is like this. I think you should refer to us those with good conditions. First, the patient's condition is good; second, his family's financial circumstances are good. In such a case, it's effortless for all of us. You know, everything can be easily worked out through talks. And then, the success rate is also high, so we will have a good start.

Investigator: Rest assured. In terms of physical condition, the doctors know to maintain a standard. Whoever has a high success rate, we'll do it for him first. Hey, let's do it like this.

Mr. Wang: Yes, yes, yes.

Investigator: Of course, this is what you call the issue of cooperation. Hey, that is, in addition, in Chao-Yang, they're now... Like in the Tianjin First Central Hospital you just mentioned, Chao-Yang Hospital, well, the Armed Police General Hospital, in terms of the cooperation among different departments, in regards to the information and the department charges, how do they co-operate on them? For example, someone is doing (an organ transplant) right now. His director tells the patient to find a donor. After the donor is found, (Mr. Wang: Sure) well, well, regarding the donor's information, how, how to handle it? To check it, the process, can you talk about this?

Mr. Wang: This is the case, this is the case, we normally check...let's first talk about the information check. Basically, we check it at the Armed Police.

Investigator: Hmm, the Armed Police General Hospital, right?

Mr. Wang: ... with real names, we check it on a real-name basis.

Investigator: Hmm.

Mr. Wang: Surgeries are performed by Chao-Yang (Hospital), so these are separate. Chao-Yang would take a look at the results of your physical examination. After the hospital looks at them, the patient would come to have a checkup again at Chao-Yang, but the donor will not go through a checkup there, (Investigator: Hmm) you know. For donors they (Chao-Yang) only look at the results from previous checkups.

Investigator: Hmm.

Mr. Wang: Then it can be done. If there's no problem, so then it can be done. Then what is their procedure? This is very crucial. Their procedure is that every year, Chao-Yang has one quota, do you know?

Investigator: Oh, yes.

Mr. Wang: There is a quota every year. I don't know whether or not your hospital has a quota. So, within the quota, when he performs a surgery for one patient, for instance, Wang So-and-so, he would do it according to the normal procedures.

Investigator: Yes.

Mr. Wang: Eh, say, brain death, or [organ] donation, then after the surgery for this patient, he does it again... when we do it again, it will be imposture. (Investigator: Ah) Using Wang So-and-so's [spot within the] quota to perform surgeries for other people.

Investigator: Well, OK. Then who gives him that quota?

Mr. Wang: His quota is assigned by the Ministry of Health.

Investigator: Ah, okay.

Mr. Wang: Or inside a hospital, a so-called quota is fulfilled following normal procedures in the hospital. You know, that is, performed according to normal, lawful procedures. After those done legally, when he does surgeries for other people, to fulfill our order, he uses the name of the individual who already had the surgery according to the normal procedure, you know, to do this operation.

Investigator: Well, that is, he normally has several spots in his quota which are already assigned with names. Then, when he does surgery, it's not the named person, but with your donors, they just replace the person's name.

Mr. Wang: Right, right. Yes, yes.

Investigator: Hey, then outside of the normal quota, does he do other surgeries?

Mr. Wang: It's like this. With one person, he can perform up to more than a dozen surgeries.

Investigator: Then, then he ...

Mr. Wang: He would use this one person's name to perform more than a dozen surgeries, you know.

Investigator: Oh, so this is the quota. So the name of one single person can be used to perform surgeries for more than a dozen individuals, right? Is this what you mean?

Mr. Wang: Yes, yes, yes.

(We can see that the annual number of organ transplant cases publicized by the communist regime, more than 10 thousands, is actually just a fraction of the real number of cases. )

Investigator: He is now...

Mr. Wang: Some related paperwork, he handles those himself. They all do this themselves. The director does it himself, such as carving stamps, etc., you know.

Investigator: Oh, oh, yes. How many people altogether are doing this right now? Who is the current director?

Mr. Wang: Now there are two directors, one is called Zhang Xiaodong. Zhang Xiaodong is one of them, and the other director is surnamed Luo, surnamed Luo or something else. Oh, both are very famous. These two directors, both of them, um.

Investigator: Oh, oh, you mentioned Zhang Xiaodong, right?

Mr. Wang: Yes.

Investigator: Hey, they, Guan Dongling, Hu Xiaopeng, these people, and Wang Wei. Are they doing it right now? They are also doing it, right?

Mr. Wang: Wang Wei and the others are all doing it, but they all follow... they have two groups, you know. Hu Xiaopeng and the others all do it by following Zhang Xiaodong.

Investigator: Oh, oh, there are also Lang Ren, Chen Dazhi, who have both performed a lot of cases, I remember.

Mr. Wang: Hey, yes, they are also both doing it.

Investigator: Oh, that is ...

Mr. Wang: You know about this very well. You indeed know about this very well.

Investigators: I'm in the same profession. For instance, Chao-Yang Hospital, the First Central Hospital, and Zheng Shusen from Zhejiang, the First Affiliated Hospital of Zhejiang University... Didn't he build a hospital called Shulan Hospital with his wife? I'm clear about all this, hmm.

Mr. Wang: Hey, right, right, right.

Investigator: Hey...

Mr. Wang: Zheng Shusen did a lot of, you know, liver transplants in the initial years. He did a lot of liver transplants.

Investigator: In those several years, such as in 2013 and 2012, he performed more than 3,000 cases in one single year. 3,000 to 4,000 cases, more than 3,000 cases.

Mr. Wang: He was...no, he started this in 2006, 2007.

Investigator: Yeah.

Mr. Wang: (Zheng) has always been doing this since 2006, 2007, right?

Investigator: Yes, (he) has always been doing it. For instance, in 2012, Huang Jiefu alone performed more than 500 cases. That, that was crazy. It was the year you mentioned, which was very crazy. These hospitals, such as that Chao-Yang Hospital, started doing it since 2000, actually.

Mr. Wang: Yes.

Investigator: Hmm, then now in Chao-Yang Hospital, now you have one person taking care of five ward beds. Then in total, how many (transplants) can they do in one month in total right now?

Mr. Wang: In one month, we can do more than 20 cases (per person) outside our own hospital.

Investigator: 20 to 30 cases, yes, 20 to 30 cases through just one of your channels. In fact, there's not only your channel, there are other channels.

Mr. Wang: Ah, several, we have several people, you know.

Investigator: Yeah.

Mr. Wang: We, there are four, four people that I know. These are just the ones that I know.

Investigator: Yes, you see that with four people, that's more than 80 cases. There would be over 100 cases per month. Yes, I know that hospital has been performing 2,000 to 3,000 cases per year, 2,000 to 3,000 cases per year. Hey, especially since 2003.

Mr. Wang: They didn't report, didn't report that many cases to the higher authorities, you know? You know, there are many, according to me, which were not reported at all, you know. There are way too many people! It's a little, a little, a little bit against common sense, you know.

Investigator: In your case, these (organ) sources are all in Beijing? Or where are they? Where are these people? Right in Beijing, right?

Mr. Wang: We have (organ sources) all over the country, do you know? We have them everywhere. Whenever you need one, he would arrive, oh.

Investigator: Oh, yes. Then your current business, that is, you just said that is in places like Zhengzhou, Guangzhou and Shanghai, hey, you all have [organ sources], right?

Mr. Wang: Yes, in all of them.

Investigator: Okay, after we start this here...

Mr. Wang: Mainly, mainly in Beijing, you know? Beijing and Zhengzhou, these two places, are the more important places. They do it in Guangdong, too, you know. Very few, they do very few cases in Guangdong.

Investigator: But they do a lot of cases in Guangxi, right? There are a lot in Guangxi.

Mr. Wang: I'm familiar with the No. 303 (Hospital) in Guangxi, too.

Investigator: But I know. Let me tell you, in Songyuan, a lot of people are locked up there. In Songyuan?

Mr. Wang: Maybe the issue you mentioned about Falun Gong... I was just chatting with a buddy in my circle today about this. He said that he was not clear about this, not clear, ha-ha.

Investigator: Let me tell you, in fact, what's used are all from Falun Gong practitioners. They just don't say that. The government encourages them to do this, but they don't dare to say this openly. Openly they say they used, let me tell you, in 2006, [they say] they used executed prisoners. After 2010, since January 1, 2015, they started [saying that they] used voluntary donation by citizens, and then there is also the black market, that is, like you, underground, underground method. In fact, these are all from the same group of people. You mentioned this, right? You are very clear about this. However, of course, all of you, certainly those people, too, dare not to say it, right? It's difficult to say, right?

Mr. Wang: Ha-ha-ha-ha-ha.

Investigator: I have discussed with the people in our hospital. This is what they think. When dealing with patients and other peripheral people, doctors, nurses and the ward staffs, you do according to your set of procedures. That is, to tell the patients to find donors. The donors we use are the donated organs found by the patients. Let's call them this, as it will be relatively safe. But to the people who take organs in the operating room, these doctors and nurses and the people, who come into direct contact with the donors, you have to tell the truth.

Mr. Wang: Hmm.

Investigator: Because once coming into contact with the donors, they would know, right?

Mr. Wang: Hmm.

Investigator: If you want to fool them, you can't. Once in contact, he realizes that oh, [the donor] is this kind of person. He feels that you lied to him. So it's hard for you.

Mr. Wang: That's right.

Investigator: When operate on Falun Gong [practitioners], the person doing the surgery, the doctors and nurses taking the organs, they have the power of the policy to

support them there. They know that for so many years, it has been alright. The upper level has approved it, the [communist] party organization has approved it, and the [communist] party committee secretary has approved it, so he dares to do it. If say, others, they would not dare to operate on. You will not get good cooperation.

Because when a person is pulled into (the operating room), and his organs are taken...

Mr. Wang: The situation is like this, it is just a matter of what you call it, you know.

This is just a matter of what you call it. There is not any, any proof to show if he is a Falun Gong [practitioner] or not, right?

Investigator: Yes. But he (the “donor”) can speak. Once he speaks out, other people will know, right? That person you got there is alive, so he can talk. Hey, wouldn't the person (who takes the organs) get to know it? Moreover, in fact, after doing it for so many years, once the donor comes, the ones who carry out these specific tasks, what don't they know? You are not, they are not all fools, right?

Mr. Wang: Alas (a long sigh)! Then let me tell you the truth. We are...if you talk about the issue of Falun Gong, that indeed happened.

Investigator:: Here is where we are now, we are just saying that with you, we need to be clear and straightforward. As to how to proceed, still follow the usual way.

Mr. Wang: Hum, now the current situation is: you should use those from the [general] society, as well. Do you understand? We're just doing it under this banner.

Investigator: Well, that's ok, alright. So you just say that however many organs from Falun Gong practitioners you can get, we'll do that many, hey, that's it.

Mr. Wang: OK OK.

Investigator: Well, but once we get started, we'll know the truth, eh, right?

Mr. Wang: Yes.

Investigator: Well, well, so, don't you understand? The donor, no matter who you say he/she is, once we start the organ excision, we'll know who this is. There is not much doubt in this, that will be a Falun Gong practitioner. Frankly, that's it. But you dare not yet directly say that all of them are Falun Gong practitioners. Ah, a small portion, you say. Alright, we do not care if you say it that way. But we both know what's really happening, right? You see I'm right, right? You tell me.

Mr. Wang: Yes, that's true. If something happens I will find someone to take the blame.

Investigator: Okay.

Mr. Wang: This actually is not too big of a problem.

Investigator: I know, since you're doing this business, you must have some background, not simple background. Eh, this is all policy stuff, from top to bottom, all are doing it.

Mr. Wang: Yes, you are right, that's the case. So let's see, today is the 9th (of January), if you wait till next month, then soon it will be the Chinese New Year, right?

Investigator: Yeah.

Mr. Wang: Is that so?

Investigator: For this year, the Chinese New Year's Eve is on the 15th, is that right?

Mr. Wang: Ah, yes.

Investigator: February 15th will be the Chinese New Year's Eve. Anyway, you get it all done 10 days before the New Year. Ah, that is...

Mr. Wang: Hmm, as for the kidneys, it should be quick, kidney [transplants] should be very quick. I think so. You'd better come early. In the next few days, please sort it out, and ask him to contact me. I will take him to do the tests, or he can go to your hospital for the tests.

Investigator: Right.

Mr. Wang: Or you can do the tests in Beijing. After the tests, he will be taken there directly. It will be very fast, just a matter of few days.

Investigator: Okay. So if my patient confirms, and I send you the patient's information, how many days do you need to get ready? He will do tests at your place. We can make it less complicated. Your side will do the tests and give us the information.

Mr. Wang: Okay.

Investigator: How many days roughly?

Mr. Wang: If he does tests on our side, it should be sorted out in a week.

Investigator: One week, so I give you the patient's medical records and information, then within one week, you can provide the donor. The person comes, that's it. Is that right?

Mr. Wang: Right.

Investigator: Okay, one week. Okay, alright.

Mr. Wang: That's right.

Investigator: Oh, is it the same for livers and kidneys?

Mr. Wang: Correct, livers and kidneys are all like this.

Investigator: Alright, okay. That was one question. Okay. So, regarding the wait time, it's just one week. Ah, including travel time, at most it will be within 10 days, ah.

Mr. Wang: Including travel time, it will be within one week. It will be very quick.

Investigator: Okay, fine. So let's make it quick. No matter how many I need, you can provide them. You can guarantee the quantity, right?

Mr. Wang: Right, right, right.

Investigator: Okay. That is what I want to hear. We will do it like this... Ah, including liver transplants, each month 20 to 30 cases, 30 to 40 cases, he can all accomplish.

Ah, kidney transplants would be even more. Kidney transplantation .....

Mr. Wang: You should consider it. You need to complete the paperwork, do you know? Because as far as I know, this stuff must be reported to the Ministry of Health, do you know? You cannot possibly report that many. You have to consider this aspect, your hospital.

Investigator: Reporting to the higher authorities, then of course, we can report less.

Ah, each month one or two cases, two or three cases, less than 10 cases. Anyways, we will try to report less. However many we do, that is a different matter. Don't we all know about that!

Mr. Wang: Hmm.

Investigator: We can also come to visit your place. We're also planning to visit Chao-Yang, the Armed Police (General Hospital), and check out their experiences. Hey, they did so many, they must be very experienced.

Mr. Wang: Regarding our side, let me tell you, the hospital on our side, before doing the operations, you cannot come.

Investigator: Hmmm, should be okay.

Mr. Wang: This cannot be via... You can come and take a look, but cannot go through my channel.

Investigator: Oh, of course.

Mr. Wang: After finishing one operation, then we become a family. We are together, then it is okay, there will be no problem.

Investigator: Right, ah, I understand.

Mr. Wang: I will go. But that, it is like this. You first send the patient over. I will take the patient there, okay? Along with the donor.

Investigator: Hmm, sure, okay. You think about it, do you still have other questions? Hmmm, no questions.

Mr. Wang: I don't have any questions.

Investigator: Okay, that is fine. So we can confirm now, our scale is, 10 to 20 livers, 40 to 50 kidneys. Later on...we are not talking about the time before the Spring Festival. Before the Spring Festival, just one liver, two kidneys. Of course, one kidney is also fine. It's up to you. Just one liver, two kidneys. After we do the first batch, afterwards it will be that scale. Within one week (Mr. Wang: Yes) you can guarantee to obtain the stuff. Oh, then let's do it. Just like that. Ah. This.....

Mr. Wang: Sure, sure.

Investigator: As for the nature of these people, we have just agreed. Hey, whatever you say, we will say the same, but basically at least we know that they are Falun Gong practitioners'. Ah, that will be fine.

Mr. Wang: Okay, okay, hmmm.

Investigator: Okay, ah, besides... oh, hey. Let's say, let's see, we, I know, you are Mr. Wang, how shall I address you? The name is Wang, with three horizontal strikes and one vertical strike.

Mr. Wang: You can call me Xiao Wang.

Investigator: Ah, okay. If you are the one, who brings the donors, you have to tell us a name.

Mr. Wang: Ah, I will arrange this, okay? I will arrange this.

Investigator: Then how shall we say it? That is, you said Chao-Yang, or what else? It belongs to Chao-Yang, this liaison office for organs? Is that so?

Mr. Wang: Hmm, that also works, sure.

Investigator: Okay, that makes it the Liaison Office for Organs of the Chaoyang Hospital, Beijing.

Mr. Wang: Okay, that works.

Investigator: Okay. Alright. That is fine now. Ah, it is fine. Usually, when is a good time to contact you? Is the current time too late for you?

Mr. Wang: It is about right. Because my schedule is not fixed. When the operations are busy, I may not be able to answer phone calls. It's hard to say. It's best if you give me a call back phone number.

Investigator: Right, I will give you one later.

Mr. Wang: You call me, if I cannot answer, I can call you back.

Investigator: Yes, I will usually give you a call, around 10 PM. This is about right, ah?

Mr. Wang: Hmm, that is about it, about it.

Investigator: Okay. Within this week, which day of the week is more convenient for you? Usually, when do you have more time? I don't want to call you when you are at your busiest.

Mr. Wang: These days I am okay, not too busy.

Investigator: Okay. Then we will do that.

Mr. Wang: The patients, as for the patients, you can contact them as soon as possible. Can you ask the patients to contact me directly, okay?

Investigator: Sure, sure, sure. Ah, I will do it as soon as possible. Alright. Then that's all for now?

Mr. Wang: Okay, alright.

Investigator: Okay, okay, oh, sure, sure.

Mr. Wang: OK, that is settled then.

Investigator: Ah, yes, yes, yes. That is settled. Let me see if there's anything else. Let me think. Let's finish here. Thank you. Okay, goodbye.

Mr. Wang: Good, Good.

Investigator: Goodbye.

Mr. Wang: Goodbye.
