Phone Investigation Recording

Nurse: Hello?

Investigator: Hey, is it better now? Can you hear me clearly?

Nurse: It's better now. Ah, wait a moment, wait, I will ask my superior, a doctor, to talk with you, okay?

Investigator: Hey, okay, thank you.

Doctor: Hello!

Investigator: Hey, is that the...

Doctor: Hi, hello.

Investigator: The hospital?

Doctor: Oh, yes.

Investigator: I am in Yinchuan, Ningxia, and my family member needs a liver transplant. Ah, I'd like to ask for some information.

Doctor: How old is this patient?

Investigator: A little over 40 years old.

Doctor: Uh, does he have liver cancer or cirrhosis?

Investigator: Late stage liver cirrhosis.

Doctor: Liver cirrhosis, right?

Investigator: Ah, late stage liver cirrhosis, um.

Doctor: What blood type?

Investigator: Um, Blood Type B.

Doctor: Blood Type B, right?

Investigator: Ah, I asked the nurse just now. I said that if the wait time is not long, then I would definitely bring the patient over...

Doctor: It is hard to tell...

Investigator: Ah.

Doctor: His blood type is B, then I, I am not sure how long he will have (to wait for) a Blood Type B liver. According to our experiences, for one year, we would perform finish about... let me see, this year, we may have done more than 50 (cases).

Investigator: Oh, is it possible to have an approximate time, such as one or two weeks, or one or two months...

Doctor: I'm not sure...

Investigator: Oh.

Doctor: After someone else donates (his organ), nobody knows if he will have an accident. Am I right?

Investigator: Oh, oh.

Doctor: There are other possibilities. Unexpectedly, maybe they don't have Blood Type B donors. Maybe they don't want to donate (their organs). These are all uncontrollable factors.

Investigator: Oh, I heard that the organs are allocated in a unified way across the country online, or in other ways?

Doctor: Well, we here...it must be unified national allocation. But first, for example, our coordinator here, that is, our coordinator here makes contacts to obtain the livers, and he would first guarantee that the patients on our waiting list (can get the organs).

Investigator: Oh, oh, like this, then I..

Doctor: I personally recommend you come back to wait (for the organ). Why? It is because the liver transplants that we do usually are emergency operations. It is equivalent to we having to do the transplant tonight. Today we need to do a liver transplantation. For example, when we do a liver transplant, we will notify the recipients immediately, the potential recipients. Then you have to come over and we have to do a series of examinations.

Investigator: Oh, let's say that, if you can look after us a little bit, we can do it in advance, right?

Doctor: Yes, at that time, you should communicate with our director, then, I don't think it should be a problem.

Investigator: Oh, you said that how many cases you have done this year? I didn't hear it clearly.

Doctor: There should be over 50 cases this year. I have not specifically counted them.

Investigator: Oh, can't you do more than 100 cases a year? 100 or 200? Do you have done this type of liver transplantation?

Doctor: Being here in Sichuan, it is difficult for us to reach this kind of numbers.

Investigator: Right, huh, oh, that...

Doctor: Because in Sichuan and Ningxia...In fact, Sichuan's economic conditions are relatively better than Ningxia's, but in the entire Sichuan, after all, not all people can afford liver transplantation.

Investigator: Oh, yes, you just said this. Then please tell me about the price, I need to prepare the money.

Doctor: In our hospital, if you do a liver transplant, the cost may be around 350,000 to 400,000 yuan, if the recovery is smooth.

Investigator: Oh.

Doctor: But if your recovery doesn't go well...this is really hard to tell.

Investigator: Oh, then, to the liver donor, do we need to give him the donor fee?

Doctor: Yes, you definitely have to give a fee to the donor, but, uh... the donor fee must be given.

Investigator: The donor fee is not included in the 350,000 yuan, right?

Doctor: No, the donor fee may cost tens of thousands of yuan.

Investigator: Oh, tens of thousands of yuan, less than 100,000 yuan?

Doctor: Uh, yes.

Investigator: No more than 100,000 yuan.

Doctor: This donor fee is a "sunny" way. For example, if someone donates an organ, he would receive a humanitarian subsidy. It is through this way, um, the corresponding institution at one hospital. It's not privately and illegally passing organs between individuals, you know?

Investigator: Oh, a friend of mine once told me that there was that kind of prisoners from prisons, or...

Doctor: This channel has now disappeared in China.

Investigator: Oh, no more, oh, no more...

Doctor: Right, this channel is no longer available in mainland China. This disappeared after 2012.

Investigator: Oh, this way.

Doctor: Yes.

Investigator: Oh, well, thank you, may I ask your surname? I will look for you later.
What's your surname?

Doctor: My surname is Yang, my surname is Yang.

Investigator: Well, Yang, Dr. Yang, Dr. Yang.

Doctor: Well, um. Yep, yep.

Investigator: Hehe... Well, then, thank you, Dr. Yang.

Doctor: Yes, yes, our director is also surnamed Yang, our director is also surnamed Yang. Our director is called Yang Hongji, and our director is also surnamed Yang. He, our director is one, who returned from Canada before, a returned specialist of organ transplantation.

Investigator: That's good, so I, I will discuss it with my family. I will see the situation...

Doctor: Actually, I hope you can come back before the Spring Festival. Why? Because you know that every year, during the Spring Festival, during the Spring Festival travel rush, there are more accidents than usual, so there are relatively more donations. We are the busiest during holidays.

Investigator: Oh, this way...
