Phone Investigation Recording

Investigator: Hey! Hello! Is that Doctor Su from the Second Affiliated Hospital of Guangzhou Medical College? Hey! I want to ask you, someone else said to me, I am...

Su Yu: My signal is not very good, I can't hear you clearly.

Investigator: Oh.

Su Yu: Hey! What do you want to ask me? Hey!

Investigator: I want to ask you, that is to say, at the Second Affiliated Hospital of Guangzhou

Medical College. Hey, do you still do kidney transplants?

Su Yu: Kidney transplants?

Investigator: Ah.

Su Yu: Yes! Under the leadership of Chen, that Director Chen Zheng, our kidney transplants are going very well!

Investigator: Oh, so, I make a phone call to ask the current surgery situation in your hospital, um, is the wait time long?

Su Yu: Oh, no! The wait time is not the issue. It should be said that in the national kidney transplant ranking, our hospital is at least in the top three.

Investigator: Oh, oh.

Su Yu: (I mean) in the whole country, whole country.

Investigator: That is, if a patient is going there, how long does he have to wait for a surgery?

Su Yu: Ah! No, this, this kind of things depend on the patient's conditions.

Investigator: Ah.

Su Yu: Yes! Because we have the most extensive kidney sources!

Investigator: Oh.

Su Yu: We have to see how the patient's conditions are, right?

Investigator: Oh.

Su Yu: Yes, if the conditions are good, it should be fast; if the conditions are not good, then there is really no way, no way.

Investigator: What do you mean when you say good conditions? What kind of conditions?

Su Yu: First, it means tissue typing, right? (Investigator: Oh). Ah, the second, the second one is your financial situation! Your finances determine the superstructure.

Investigator: Oh.

Su Yu: You can't afford these expenses, if your financial situation is bad. Then, how do you expect the doctors to do it? Is that right?

Investigator: Hah, that, Doctor Su, there's no problem with the finances. That is definitely guaranteed.

Su Yu: Ok.

Investigator: No problem.

Su Yu: Ok.

Investigator: Ah! That is to say. (Su Yu: Yeah.) Now, you just said, our donors in general, uh, are they healthy?

Su Yu: As for our donors, the largest feature of our hospital is the living relative donors. (Investigator: Ah.) That is, living donors. All aspects of the examinations are definitely the most stringent. (Investigator: Ah.) Right? The second type of donors, uh, and also the main source of donors is from donations. That is, brain-dead patients. (Investigator: Uh!) The brain-dead patients. (Investigator: Oh.) The patients, whose brains have already died. In this aspect, the protection is very exact. Unlike getting (the organs) from prisoners in the past, right? After they were shot, we could take their organs and get their blood samples, then we could do the tests.

(Investigator: Ah.) However, that is, right now, um, the quantity of body donations is very large.

There at least over 250 cases in one year, right?

Investigator: Oh!

Su Yu: Ah.

Investigator: You? Su Yu: So, so...

Survey: What do you mean? What do you mean by 250?

Su Yu: Ah?

Investigator: What do you mean by the 250? I didn't hear it clearly.

Su Yu: Ah, that is to say, this kind of body donations!

Investigator: Oh! That is, your hospital can get 250 bodies from donation each year.

Su Yu: I estimate that there would be more than this number during 17 years!

Investigator: Oh, more than that, oh.

Su Yu: Right, right. Yes. Now, they have exceeded 300 at present. They exceeded 300 in July.

Investigator: Oh, by the 300, you mean that 300 kidney transplants have been done, or you mean 300 dead bodies?

Su Yu: 300 donated bodies!

Investigator: Oh! Then you did a lot of operations! There're two kidneys in one body.

Su Yu: Oh! No, no, no. This, for this kind of things, you can't take all of them, right? You have to consider the feelings of your sister hospitals, right? You can't take both kidneys, just being fair, right?

Investigator: I want to ask you, Dr. Su, another question. That is, where did these bodies come from?

Su Yu: Aren't these all brain-dead patients!?

Investigator: Those are from brain-dead patients. Can your hospital have so many brain-dead patients?

Su Yu: Definitely not! From all over the country.

Investigator: Oh, all over the country. Then they're allocated in a unified way by the state? (Su Yu: Right).

Su Yu: Ah, that's for sure! But this allocation is still...The more powerful your hospital is, the more you are allocated with. There's such a saying.

Investigator: Then, if you say that they are allocated across the country, why is it... From where can they be allocated to you... you, since they are so far away?

Su Yu: This, this is not the case. This thing, well, it is hard to say, because I am just a urologist. They are the kidney transplant department.

Investigator: Ah.

Su Yu: Regarding this kind of things, I, I don't dare to talk about it. Anyway, the more powerful a hospital is, the more powerful it becomes. There's such a saying.

Investigator: Oh?

Su Yu: Right.

Investigator: Oh, you said that this Red Cross Society also wants to donate. They have donations in this aspect? Do they have donors?

Su Yu: This, uh, no, no, no, I really don't understand this kind of things. In one sentence, okay? Because, if you want to come, you should come to get registered first, and find someone in our organ transplant department to register first.

Investigator: Oh.

Su Yu: And then, based on the patient's condition, we will...Since I do not represent them, (you need to find) the section chief of the kidney transplant department. We were all in the urology department in the past, and they were separated from the urology department at the beginning, so at that time, in 2003 and 2002, we still had a close relationship. (Investigator: Oh.) Then, we were growing up just like brothers, yeah. (Investigator: Oh, oh.) Yeah! Right! I still know their situation.

Investigator: Oh.

Su Yu: But regarding the specific and more specific things, you must first go to them for registration. You are sure willing to come to our hospital, our organ transplant department, to do

this operation. Then, we will take your blood sample (Investigator: Ah.) to figure out the tissue typing. (Investigator: Ah.) Then, they will have a general statement to communicate with you. (Investigator: Oh, oh.) Is that right? Since there are many details in it, we really don't know them at all.

Investigator: Oh.

Su Yu: Is that right? However, roughly speaking, when doing kidney transplants, including our own relatives and friends, they have to do so, too. (Investigator: Oh.) The organ transplant department just told me here, "You take the blood samples and receive the patients first." (Investigation: Oh.) Yeah! We first get the tissue typing, for the others, we can have a talk by that time. (Investigator: Oh.) Then we will stop here! And I don't know anything else at all. Investigator: Oh, that is, Chen Zheng is still leading you there right now? Leading the doctors to do it, right? Chen Zheng.

Su Yu: It is definitely Chen Zheng! Now Chen Zheng is the director of the administrative department! (Investigator: Oh.) Certainly, everything is based on communication with him. (Investigation: Oh, that...) Yes! (Investigator: Well...)

Investigator: Doctor Su, you said that, if there are 300 donors, how many can our hospital enjoy? Then you said that you have to take care of the other hospitals or deliver (the organs) to them. Su Yu: One person has two kidneys. It is guaranteed that we get 300 (kidneys) first! For the remaining kidneys, we must take care of the others' feelings! There are so many sister hospitals across the country, so you can't use them all, right?

Investigator: That is, for the 300 donors, we only get 300 kidneys. The (other) 300 kidneys have to be shared with others?

Su Yu: Absolutely! You can't do them all by yourself. People could be..., you must be aware that "being bound together for good or ill". If the level of kidney transplant in our entire mainland China goes up, (Investigator: Oh, oh.) it makes sense. However, it is meaningless at all if it is only your hospital doing great.

Investigator: Oh! Then you said that these should be shared with others. In general, are they sent to our local hospitals, such as the affiliated hospitals of Sun Yat-sen University?

Su Yu: No, no, no. This, this, I am not clear at all about this.

Investigator: Oh, okay.

Su Yu: Because of this, this is something in their section. (Investigator: Oh.) Then I, I, because, we are still sister sections, so sometimes we listen to what they say, just like this.

Investigator: Oh! Oh! Oh.

Su Yu: Right.

Investigator: That, then okay. Then I would thank you for that. I would take a look and contact with them ASAP. (Su Yu: Oh) See when I can do it, (Su Yu: Right, right, right!) okay?

Su Yu: Right! Good, good. Thanks, Ah, Good, good.

Investigator: Good!
