- 2. The organs from executed prisoners and/or Falun Gong practitioners have nothing to do with the Red Cross Society in Jilin. The Red Cross staff has no idea about them.

Phone Investigation Recording

Investigator: Hi, hello, is that the Organ Donation Division of the Red Cross of Jilin Province?

Mr. Liu: Yes.

Investigator: I noticed that the First Hospital of Jilin University is engaged in an activity called "Previous Kids", which is free of charge. The relationship between the donor livers and the Red Cross of yours is...

Investigator: Oh, oh. All the organs that they have, are they provided by your Red Cross? Mr. Liu: No, not by us.

Investigator: Well, then, that is to say that the Red Cross is just getting started in the past two or three years. It's just these years, most of the country...

Mr. Liu: Ah, ah. We are supposed to have started the (organ donation) pilot project in 2011, and carried on till now.

Investigator: I heard that major hospitals can find organs from donors such as those executed prisoners, or (Falun) Gong practitioners. They can be used before the year 2015, right? That kind of organs would pass through your Red Cross, right? That means they could use them directly.

Mr. Liu: Ah, ah. Anyhow, we must be present at the site (of the donation) as long as they are donated through the Red Cross. We don't know about their stuff. That is the business of the hospitals and has nothing to do with our Red Cross Society. That's the business of (the Ministry of) Health, and I don't know about it.

Investigator: I..., pardon, what's your surname?

Mr. Liu: My...my last name is Liu, too.

Investigator: Oh, Mr. Liu. (Mr. Liu: I...). Thank you very much!

Mr. Liu: Ah, that's OK.
