Summary

- 1. Last year Director Cao said the hospital became qualified to do kidney transplantation.
- 2. The hospital started doing kidney transplants this year, and they do a lot.
- 3. "We could do about 10 to 12 kidney transplants every month."
- 4. It is impossible to predict when there would be suitable kidney sources. "If someone tells you one month, two months, three months, they would all be lying."
- 5. Patients with Blood Type B are not difficult to find donors. Their organ wait time is shorter than others. The hospital did 6 kidney transplantations of Type B in the first half of this month.
- 6. The donors are distributed from the state organ allocation website.

Phone Investigation Recording

Doctor Meng: Hello?

Investigator: Hi, hello, Doctor Meng! Can you hear me?

Doctor Meng: Hello?

Investigator: Can you hear me now?

Doctor Meng: I can hear you.

Investigator: Yes. Hi, I have a patient, who wants to do a kidney transplant. (Meng:

Okay.) I help him make this inquiry. He's in Guangdong.

Doctor Meng: Where is he now?

Investigator: He is from Shenzhen. But he came to Hong Kong for work.

Doctor Meng: Okay.

Investigator: I help him contact the hospital. I remember last year I called Director Cao and asked them if they had started doing organ transplantation. He said it was just approved. (Doctor Meng: Right.) I thought the patient should go to other hospitals, but there are too many patients waiting in other hospitals. So, I think maybe there are not too many patients waiting in your hospital. So I want to contact your hospital first, to see if you've started doing it this year. Because I called but the director was not here.

Doctor Meng: Uh-huh.

Investigator: So it means you already...

Doctor Meng: He could come!

Investigator: It started this year. Have you done many kidney transplants this year?

Doctor Meng: We did a lot!

Investigator: Did you do more than 100?

Doctor Meng: What? Investigator: Over 100?

Doctor Meng: Not that many. No such hospital could do that many now.

Investigator: No? How many did you do roughly?

Doctor Meng: Please tell him to come directly. (Investigator: I want to check with you

first that...) We will see his condition first.

Investigator: So...

Doctor Meng: You could, yes. Investigator: Yes, go ahead?

Doctor Meng: We could do about 10 to 12 kidney transplants every month.

Investigator: Okay.

Doctor Meng: It is the largest number in Guangdong Province.

Investigator: Really? There are lots of hospitals, which can do the organ transplants in

Guangdong. So...

Doctor Meng: Right. Right.

Investigator: So I called Director Cao last year, and I want to double check that if we decide to go there, compare to the other hospitals... I think you should have less patient in the line. You just started, maybe not everyone knows your qualification yet. So my opinion is... (Doctor Meng: Uh-huh.) coming to your hospital. Do you have a long line waiting? Relatively?

Doctor Meng: There are fewer people waiting compared to other hospitals. But still not too few.

Investigator: Okay. How long should we wait for the kidney transplantation?

Doctor Meng: It is hard to say. It depends on your blood type, the tissue typing, and the patient's luck!

Investigator: Oh.

Doctor Meng: One month, two to three months, or three to five months. We have all cases.

Investigator: Okay.

Doctor Meng: If someone tells you one month, two months, three months,

(Investigator: Okay.) they would all be lying.

Investigator: Oh, yeah?

Doctor Meng: That's impossible.

Investigator: Okay, so...

Doctor Meng: It is impossible to tell when we would have suitable kidneys. It can't be predicted. Those kinds are all deceptive!

Investigator: About the donation, are the organs from the Red Cross Society or the state's organ distribution network?

Doctor Meng: That's right. Right.

Investigator: Which one? Do you mean from the distribution network, or from the

Red Cross Society?

Doctor: The distribution network. Investigator: From the network?

Doctor Meng: Yes.

Investigator: So when will you have suitable donors? Then you could do the

matching, right?

Doctor Meng: Correct.

Investigator: Can you guarantee the quality of the donors?

Doctor Meng: For sure. Investigator: Is that so?

Doctor Meng: We don't use bad-quality organs. We never do harm to anyone.

Investigator: What is the price? Can you give me a quote?

Doctor Meng: Now we better... If you can't find him, you could come to talk to us.

Investigator: Okay.

Doctor Meng: Right. It is not very convenient to talk over the phone.

Investigator: Okay, alright.

Doctor Meng: If you are interested, you could make an appointment with us.

Investigator: Okay. I will let the patient know, and see what he thinks.

Doctor Meng: Okay.

Investigator: Okay, I will tell him.

Doctor Meng: Sure. What is his blood type?

Investigator: Type B.

Doctor Meng: B? It is not that hard to find Blood Type B.

Investigator: Type B? So the wait time for a patient with blood type B...

Doctor Meng: Okay.

Investigator: ...would be shorter?

Doctor Meng: The wait time for type B is shorter. We already did 6 B-type liver

transplants in this month.

Investigator: You mean this month or last month?

Doctor Meng: This month.

Investigator: Okay. Have you already done 6 organ transplants of blood type B in the

first half of this month? Doctor Meng: Yes, yes!

Investigator: Okay. It looks like Type B donors are easy to get. It means it is hopeful

for him, right?

Doctor Meng: Yeah. Investigator: Right.

Doctor Meng: Yes. If you have a lot of patients... Actually, you can come here or

they can come themselves.

Investigator: Okay.

Doctor Meng: But a lot of things are not good to disclose over the phone, okay?

Investigator: Okay. You're not far from us anyway.

Doctor Meng: Right.

Investigator: Okay. Thank you, Doctor Meng.

Doctor Meng: Okay. You could also add me on WeChat.

Investigator: Add you on WeChat? Your phone number is your WeChat account

number?

Doctor Meng: Correct.

Investigator: You've got it. You did 10 or 20 kidney transplants. In this month alone, you did 6 cases. Then you should have done more than 20 kidney transplants, right? Doctor Meng: It is impossible to do that many organ transplants every month. There is no such an average number.

Investigator: Okay, it means....

Doctor Meng: It is not possible that I can do as many as I want.

Investigator: Okay.

Doctor Meng: Alright?

Investigator: Maybe there are more cases this month so you did more. Sometimes it is

less.

Doctor Meng: Exactly. If someone tells you a monthly standard, that hospital is lying

for sure!

Investigator: Okay. You are very practical. Thank you. Bye-bye.

Doctor Meng: Uh-huh.
