Summary

1. The ward can do more than a dozen kidney transplants in a month. As of September 2017, they've done about 200 kidney transplants.
2. The ward has three surgery teams.
3. “(Organ donors) come in batches. Sometimes several could come in, sometimes we would rest for a couple of days, then we have another batch of organ donors.”
4. Donors would come into the hospitals, instead of organs. “Because our hospital has the qualification, we could excise (organs) by ourselves.”

Phone Investigation Recording

Nurse: Hello?

Investigator: Yes, hello. Is that the kidney transplant ward at Sun Yat-sen Hospital?

Nurse: Yes.

Investigator: Does Wang Changxi do the kidney transplantation in this ward?

Nurse: Wang Changxi is on a business trip. What is your inquiry?

Investigator: On business? Yes, I am looking for him. I have a patient, who wants to do a kidney transplantation. Do you still do a lot of kidney transplants?

Nurse: Yes, a lot. But Director Wang is currently not here.

Nurse: Which doctor are you looking for? Are other doctors okay for you except Director Wang?

Investigator: That's fine. I'd like to learn about it first. Then I will take the patient here and can find other doctors for him.

Nurse: Let me check if there are other doctors available.

Investigator: Okay, thank you.

Doctor: Hello?

Investigator: Yes, hello. Is Director Wang Changxi on business trip, so he's not here?

Doctor: What?

Investigator: I am a doctor from Union Hospital in Hong Kong. I wanted to send a patient to Director Wang to do the kidney transplantation, but he is not here. I want to know if you do a lot of kidney transplantations this year? The patient will come here if you do a lot.

Doctor: What organ transplantation? Lung transplantation? We don't do lung transplantation.

Investigator: No, kidney transplantation. You listened wrong. Kidney transplantation.

Doctor: I don't know about this year, and I don't know the exact statistics.

Investigator: Do you do a lot?

Doctor: It is fine, according to the frequency.

Investigator: Do you do it every day or every week? I will let the patient go to your hospital if you do a lot.

Doctor: Um... Not that frequently. They come in batches. Sometimes several could come in, sometimes we would rest for a couple of days, then we have another batch of several surgeries.

Investigator: Okay. How many could you do in a month?

Doctor: We keep doing it non-stop. Let's put it this way. Non-stop.

Investigator: How many organ transplants could you do in a month approximately? Ten or twenty organ transplants? Can you do 20?

Doctor: It is about more than a dozen organ transplants.

Investigator: In one month.

Doctor: It should be.

Investigator: Have you done one more than 100 organ transplants this year?

Doctor: I don't know the general statistics because we have several surgery teams. I'm not very clear about the other groups.

Investigator: Okay, so it is....

Doctor: By estimation, maybe.

Investigator: Did your team do a lot of kidney transplants? How many has your team done?

Doctor: I can't tell you the statistics. We do it non-stop, anyway. Haha.

Investigator: So how many organ transplant teams do you have? Seems you have a lot.

Doctor: There are three teams here.

Investigator: Three. As of September, you could do ten or twenty transplants in a month, so is it about 200 transplants so far?

Doctor: Maybe, roughly.

Investigator: You mean not only the Second Ward does organ transplantation, but the Third Ward also does it, right?

Doctor: The Third Ward is in Huangpu District. I don't know about Huangpu.

Investigator: Okay, you mean that three teams could do about over 20 organ transplants each month, right?

Doctor: What? I can't hear you clearly.

Investigator: In one month, you can do more than 20 kidney transplants?

Doctor: Almost. I really don't know about the details, as I told you before.

Investigator: The patient will have the confidence if he knows that you could do a lot, so he would come here quickly to do it. That's why I asked.

Doctor: It's basically like that. I can't answer you in detail.

Investigator: Okay. Alright, I will...

Doctor: If he comes, he should submit the forms, and do the tissue typing. He should submit his tissue typing documents first.

Investigator: Okay, okay. So we should do the tissue typing first?

Doctor: Yes, exactly.

Investigator: When you said they come "in batches", I didn't quite understand. What do you mean by "batches"?

Doctor: In batches. It's like a trend. Organ donors would come in batches. It's not definite, sometimes they come continuously.

Investigator: Okay, so here come the donors, not the organs?

Doctor: Right. Because our hospital has the qualification, we could excise (organs) by ourselves. We often excise them ourselves.

Investigator: Okay then, I'll contact him again, when I get a chance. Thank you!
