## **Summary**

The patients can use their medical insurance for the organ transplantation. "If the kidney is supplied by a relative, it costs about 120,000 yuan (with medical insurance)." An allogeneic kidney transplant (where the patient would wait for the kidney) would cost 100,000 yuan with medical insurance. (Investigator: You've been doing it all the time, are there several hundred cases then?) Nurse: It should be (that many). (Investigator: How many hundreds have you done this year?) Nurse: We could do several hundred cases (of organ transplantation operations), there should be several hundred cases.

Investigator: Hello! Is that the First Affiliated Hospital of Zhejiang University?

Nurse: What?

Investigator: Is that the First Affiliated Hospital of Zhejiang University?

Nurse: Yes. (It is our) hospital.

Investigator: I want to ask if the hospital accepts the medical insurance. Can the organ transplantation patients use the medical insurance?

Nurse: The medical insurance, yes, they can!

Investigator: Oh, they can. Does that apply to both kidney and liver transplants?

Nurse: I am not clear about liver transplants. But you can use (medical insurance) for kidney transplants.

Investigator: Yes, huh? Now we have a kidney transplant, how much do we have to pay for the kidney transplant? How much do we have to pay out of our own pocket? How much is reimbursed?

Nurse: It seems that after the reimbursement, I'm not quite sure... In general, if the kidney is supplied by a relative, it is about 120,000 yuan.

Investigator: What if it is an allogeneic kidney transplant?

Nurse: That's the kind of situation, where you have to line up (for a donor organ), right?

Investigator: Ah.

Nurse: That could cost 100,000 yuan.

Investigator: 100,000 yuan, then the rest can be paid with medical insurance, right?

Nurse: Yes. They can all be reimbursed.

Investigator: Oh, so we can go our own work units to get reimbursed, right?

Nurse: Um, I am not sure about that!

Investigator: It means....

Nurse: It depends on what kind of medical insurance you have. Investigator: Oh, oh, oh, it depends on the company, right?

Nurse: Yes, it does.

Investigator: Oh, then it depends on the fee needed after getting reimbursed from

different work units. How much does the hospital deduct, and then how much should the

patient pay? Nurse: Yes.

Investigator: Oh, when does it come into effect?

Nurse: The medical insurance?

Investigator: Yes.

Nurse: I don't know. But it can be reimbursed right now.

Investigator: Are you doing a lot of organ transplantation operations now? Because last

year I have a friend who....

Nurse: (We have been) doing it all the time, doing it all the time.

Investigator: Doing it all the time, are there several hundred cases then?

Nurse: It should be (that many).

Investigator: Oh, you mean you are doing the organ transplantations every day, right?

Nurse: Yes.

Investigator: Did you do a lot of kidney transplantations last year? Did you reach 500 or

600 cases?

Nurse: Let me tell you, we are doing the kidney transplantations all the time, we will do it whenever there is one (organ). Some use (organs provided by the patients') relatives, and there's another situation, where people wait in line (for organs).

Investigator: Because my friend said you could do at least 500 or 600 organ

transplantation operations in a year. How many hundreds have you done this year?

Nurse: We could do several hundred cases (of organ transplantation operations), there should be several hundred cases.
