Phone Investigation Recording

Investigator: Hey, Xiao Wang, hey, hello.

Wang: Hey.

Investigator: Hey.

Wang: Hey.

Investigator: I am, huh.

Wang: You first.

Investigator: I want to ask you about the person you mentioned. How have you been contacting with him? Is that OK?

Wang: What should I put it? I think I'm still a little worried about him. I am still not sure about the situation on his side.

Investigator: Hey, do you think it works?

Wang: Um, I think it depends on his side. How can he operate this matter, because we have talked twice.

Investigator: Ah.

Wang: We talked twice. I'd say that you can introduce the patients to me first, ok?

Investigator: Ah.

Wang: If there are patients, then we can go on talking about it. If there are no patients, then there is nothing to talk, right?

Investigator: Do you think it is feasible? If he wants to do it, do you think it is feasible?

Wang: I think that as long as he dares to do it, how can it not be feasible?

Investigator: Just...

Wang: It is feasible as long as he dares to do it.

Investigator: Yes. My elder sister's child is at the hospital of Sun Yat-sen University now, and there has been no news yet! He registered at the hospital of Sun Yat-sen University. Your last small advertisement was posted in Shanghai, right? Why did I call you? It's because you are in Shanghai, and he, my sister's child, is close to Shanghai, so he wants to go to Shanghai. However, you then told us to go to Beijing. Of course he does not want to go to Northern China. Southerners are not willing to go to ~

Wang: No...

Investigator: Ah?

Wang: I told you that we are like this.

Investigator: Ah.

Wang: We are accepting, not just accepting domestic orders, but also foreign ones, like from Argentina, the United States and Italy. These Chinese people, who came back from abroad, are doing it like this, do you know? It is for all Chinese people. This is one thing. So, these advertisements not only appear in Shanghai, but also in Hong Kong and Taiwan, do you know? They are everywhere, in fact.

Investigator: Oh.

Wang: Do you understand what I mean?

Investigator: I say, since you are in Beijing, you should write “Beijing” (on your advertisement), then he would go to Beijing to find you, right?

Wang: I didn’t write it, and I didn’t write “Shanghai” on the small advertisement, either.

Investigator: The small advertisements that they gave to me stated “Shanghai”. Of course, I didn’t see the small advertisement myself. He told me that there was a small advertisement in Shanghai, he said so.

Wang: It is inside all the hospitals, do you know? Many hospitals have it. So it is not like in the hospitals, where the advertisement is posted, the surgeries would take place there. It’s not like that.

Investigator: Oh, so this is the case. If he is in Shanghai, but he wants to do it at the hospital of Sun Yat-sen University, can you help him find a good one, give him....

Wang: I have no problem finding donors. It just depends on whether they could do it for him or not.

Investigator: It is not suitable (for me) to deal with them directly? Can we negotiate this matter with them?

Wang: I can provide you with my connections. You can deal with them yourself. This is no problem.

Investigator: If my nephew is going to do it in Shanghai, and you can find a relatively good donor and let him do it earlier, that is also good.

Wang: It is mostly up to you, where do you want to do it. If you want to do it in Beijing, you can come over to do it at any time, understand? But if you have to do it in Shanghai, you’d have find the connections by yourself. I’ll definitely have no problem supplying the donor.

Investigator: How do I find the connections by myself? Would you provide me with some connections? Then after I find him, shall I let him contact the hospital?

Wang: Then you go directly to look for the director.

Investigator: Which one do I look for?

Wang: Go directly to look for the director.

Investigator: Looking for the director of the hospital?

Wang: Yes, look for the director of the department, the director of the organ transplantation department. Alas! But it is basically useless, if you don’t have the backing of a provincial level (official), he will not do this for you. Do you know?

Investigator: But how can you do it in Beijing? Then why you can't do it in Shanghai? He does not want to go to Beijing. He thinks that it is cold and unfamiliar in Beijing.

Wang: On our side, we have been cooperating together for many years, you know.

Investigator: Oh.

Wang: (My connections) in Beijing have support from people within the central government, you know? They're not afraid.

Investigator: Hey, Xiao Wang, can I help refer this kind of donors to you? Guess you can organize so many people, you must need someone to help find donors! I think this may be easy, right?

Wang: We has been doing this for so many years, we have young gang members specializing in doing it. And it is not difficult at all, you know? It's not hard to find donors at all, you know, there are a lot of them. You don't have to think about the donor issue.

Investigator: No need?

Wang: Don't think about the donors, you can just pay attention to the patients. If you want to earn a little bit of money, you may consider the patients. For the patients, first, the profit is more; second, you don't take any responsibility, no responsibility, you know?

Investigator: Hey, you said finding patients is difficult. It is not so easy to find them?

Wang: Yes, but if you know the directors at the hospitals, then it would be easy to find patients. If you have connections with the directors, you will find a lot of patients.

Investigator: What do you mean by "connections with the director"? Of course, I know some directors.

Wang: That is actually a very simple matter. As long as the director says a sentence, such as "I have (patients). I know the person, who has this (patient). You can go to look for him directly." If the director just tells the patient this one sentence, it is definitely useful to the patient, who will then look for us directly, you know. So the money will follow, right?

Investigator: Then the person you mentioned. I have never met him. How many donors did he ask from you for every month? How many donors?

Wang: He said that he will do several hundred cases of surgeries a year!

Investigator: Several hundred cases?! Wow, so many! (Wang: Well.) Several hundreds of cases. Can you bring him several hundred cases? Can you bring them to him from Beijing?

Wang: Actually, this will happen later. We can deal with it. Or, you can go to their place to get the donor, you know. In Beijing, Xi'an and Zhengzhou, we all have places, where they can excise (organs). This will take place later. The main issue is, do you dare to do (surgeries) with black-market (organs)? If you dare to do it, or you say, "It's ok or no problem", then all of us can do it together, right?

Investigator: Oh.

Wang: We talked a bit the other day. We talked about it on that day. The final decision is that you should find patients to bring them here. When you find a patient, and I

have a look of him/her. Since I have been doing it for so many years, at one glance, I would know whether he/she is a patient or not, and what is going on.

Investigator: The patient....I need go to Beijing, take him to Beijing?

Wang: Yes, to have check-ups in Beijing.

Investigator: Is it necessary to do the check-ups at the armed police hospital? The Armed Police Hospital that you mentioned last time?

Wang: No, he can be checked in other hospitals, too. But why doing the tests at the Armed Police Hospital? Because the results come out faster, if you do the check-up in the Armed Police Hospital, and the accuracy rate is also relatively high.

Investigator: Yes. They do few cases at the Zhejiang Provincial People's Hospital, so they can't get the donors. They are basically doing (transplants) at Zheng Shusen's First Affiliated Hospital of Zhejiang University.

Wang: No, it is not the donor issue for us. We have donors, don't we!

Investigator: Oh, oh.

Wang: The problem we have is about the patients, do you know?

Investigator: For example, at the Zhejiang Provincial People's Hospital, there was one patient transferred from Shanghai General Hospital for liver transplantation. As it turned out, they have no donors for liver transplantation right now. If I talk with the hospital, and can you provide livers to them, okay?

Wang: If he dares to do it, that's fine with me, as long as he dares to do it!

Investigator: Then tell me, from where do you take (organs)? They also have time limits, for the livers, you don't...

Wang: We excise livers from living bodies, we excise livers from living bodies!

Investigator: I am still wondering, Xiao Wang. If you have so many people doing transplants, how many people do you have to keep in captivity? How big are your places to accommodate these people?

Wang: I think that you don't need to consider this. I find that you have really been talking about this matter all the time, right?

Investigator: I just wonder. Where do you put all these people? I find it curious...

Wang: Yes, if you have time, you can go online to search about it, just check it out. There may be such related reports, so take a look.

Investigator: You see that Zheng Shusen is mainly doing liver transplantation. He doesn't use, he doesn't use...

Wang: Can Zheng still do surgeries right now? He is still working on the operating table? He is not working on the operating table now, right?

Investigator: He is.

Wang: He is rarely on the operating table, right?

Investigator: You just check it out...

Wang: Sometimes he is like this. He used to be like this a few years ago, since around the year 2006, when I was in the First Affiliated Hospital of Zhejiang University, you know.

Investigator: Ah.

Wang: 2006.

Investigator: Ah.

Wang: I was in the First Affiliated Hospital of Zhejiang University at that time. I had delivered donors to them. I had sent them a lot of donors! Do you know?

Investigator: At that time, he was in the First Affiliated Hospital of Zhejiang University. He hadn't founded the (Zhejiang University) International Hospital!

Wang: The First Affiliated Hospital of Zhejiang University, he was there at that time.

Investigator: He was in the First Affiliated Hospital of Zhejiang University at that time, and he just set up the International Hospital last year.

Wang: Where is the International Hospital now?

Investigator: It's also in Hangzhou. You can check it out. It is located in Hangzhou. You check it. It is affiliated to the Zhejiang Medical University, also known as Shulan Hospital or the International Hospital. But I don't know whether you can give donors to him now--can you give them to him? I guess Zheng Shusen has his own way to get donors.

Wang: He has channels, yes, he has channels.

Investigator: So, I think that he won't want your donors. He may be able to get them directly. Just like your Armed Police Hospital has connections, and they can go directly to some prisons to take donors. He might be able to get donors, as he has connections. You can have a look, his hospital has done more than 100 cases just after its establishment last year. I did not ask him directly, but I asked a doctor under him. He said, "President Zheng has his own way, so we have done a lot. President Zheng has his own way."

Wang: That's right. That's right.

Investigator: Ah? What did you say?

Wang: Of course, Zheng definitely has his way (to obtain organs). Absolutely, 100%.

Investigator: In 2006, Zheng would ask for your donors, when you had contact with him.

Wang: He had done a lot of cases. He had been doing them all the time before 2011.

Investigator: Yes. When you gave donors to him at that time, there were definitely death-row inmates and Falun Gong practitioners in the prisons at that time, right? It is different now.

Wang: Yes.

Investigator: He is doing more now. Xiao Wang, as you said that in 2006, you gave him donors from prisons, like Falun Gong practitioners. That was allowed by the state government. Was it easy at that time? In general, you could provide (donors) to them from (prisoners and practitioners).

Wang: Yes.

Investigator: But when did (the donor sources) start to become limited? From which year?

Wang: (The donor sources) started to become limited after the year 2011.

Investigator: So, before 2011, you could get the donors from prisons, such as Falun Gong practitioners, but you can't get them after 2011?

Wang: I can also get (practitioners) after 2011, but there are relatively less and less. You know?

Investigator: That's ok, I am delaying your work today. I called you yesterday and you didn't pick up. So I thought maybe you were busy yesterday. You didn't pick up twice.

Wang: I had a surgery yesterday.

Investigator: Had a surgery yesterday? Oh.

Wang: Hmm. That's ok, all right.

Investigator: That's it. I won't bother you anymore. I heard that in Beijing, it seems that the flu is more severe than the South!

Wang: The flu is quite severe these days.

Investigator: Ok, goodbye, bye!

Wang: Hey, bye.
